

JULY 17, 2022 6TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



Today's Gospel lesson begins with some folk bringing to Jesus a paralytic. It does not say what those people coming to Jesus were looking for, but Jesus sees their faith and pardons sins of the paralytic. We might infer from this that this is exactly what these folks were seeking. By the end of the story they will get even more - their friend, the paralytic will be healed. But it is possible that the man wanted forgiveness more than anything else and Jesus correctly discerned this. He heals the man only as the afterthought, to prove that his words about forgiveness are real. Dear Brethren, we love miracles of

all sorts, but in Christianity they are supposed to be signs pointing to the Kingdom of God. They are not the main attraction. Yet the attraction of miracles, and even magical events captures the attraction of many Christians. Remember, in loving the miracles, we can lose sight of their purpose and meaning. Note: In the Gospel lesson, the people marveled, not that the man was healed, but that Christ has the power to heal! They actually are on to something important and aren't being distracted by the miracle.

Troparion, T.5: Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word,* coeternal with the Father and the Spirit,* and born of the Virgin for our salvation.* For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh, to suffer death* and to raise the dead by His glorious resurrection.

Troparion, **T.8**: Christ our God, You are glorified above all,* You established our fathers as beacons on earth* and through them guided all of us to the true faith.* Glory to You, most compassionate Lord.

Kontakion, T.5: You, my Saviour, descended to Hades,* and as the Almighty, You shattered its gates.* With Yourself You, as the Creator, raised the dead and shattered the sting of death,* and delivered Adam from the curse, O Lover of Mankind.* And so we cry out: "Save us, O Lord."

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion, T.6: The Son who ineffably shone from the Father* was born two-fold of nature from a woman.* Beholding Him, we do not reject the image of His form;* but depicting it, we revere it faithfully.* Therefore, the Church, holing the true faith,* kisses the icon of Christ's becoming man.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Theotokion, T.6: Undaunted patroness of Christians,* O steadfast intermediary with the Creator,* turn not away from the suppliant voices of sinners,* but in your kindness come to help us who cry out to you in faith.* Be quick to intercede, make haste to plead,* for you are ever the patroness of those who honour you, O Mother of God.

Prokeimenon, T.5: You, O Lord, will guard us and will keep us* from this generation and for ever.

verse: Save me, O Lord, for there is no longer left a just man.

A READING OF THE EPISTLE OF ST. PAUL TO THE ROMANS (12:6-14):

Brothers and Sisters, we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.

ARCHBISHOP GALLAGHER: 'I WOULDN'T RULE OUT POPE GOING TO UKRAINE IN AUGUST'

In an interview with Italian news program Tg1, Archbishop Paul Richard Gallagher, Secretary for Relations with States, says Pope Francis believes a visit to Ukraine would have positive results, and offers condolences for the death of former Japanese PM Abe Shinzo.

Preparations for a papal visit to Ukraine will begin after his Apostolic Journey to Canada, and the Pope could travel to Kyiv as early as August. Archbishop Paul Richard Gallagher offered that insight to Ignazio Ingrao during an interview on the Italian TV news program Tg1, during which he expressed condolences for the assassination of former Japanese Prime Minister Abe Shinzo.

"The Pope," said Archbishop Gallagher, "is very convinced that if he were to make a visit it would have positive results. He has said that he will go to Ukraine, and he has always been willing to visit Moscow and meet with the Russian authorities."

Asked if the trip to Kyiv could take place upon his return from Canada, where Pope Francis will be in the last week of July, the Archbishop said, "Yes, I think that upon returning from Canada we will begin to really study the possibility."

Regarding the timing of a potential visit, the Vatican's Secretary for Relations with States said it could happen in August. "Possibly, I wouldn't rule it out. However, a lot depends on the results of the trip to Canada. Let's see how the Pope will withstand this trip, which is also very demanding, and then we'll see."

Archbishop Gallagher also spoke about discussions with Russia regarding a papal trip to Moscow. "Our contacts with the Russian Federation right now are rather institutional through the Apostolic Nuncio in Moscow and through the Russian Ambassador here at the Holy See. Beyond that there are not many direct or personal contacts," said the Archbishop. "While we are very concerned about Ukrainian issues and the resolution of the war, at the same time we are concerned about the future of the Western Balkans."

Archbishop Gallagher then responded to a question about the ecumenical challenge and a possible meeting between the Pope and Patriarch Kirill.

"I believe that if the Patriarch and the Holy Father travel all the way to Kazakhstan for this great conference of world religions, then yes, there will be a meeting. We must try to overcome difficulties and misunderstandings for the unity of the Church."
